## THE TAKE-HOME MESSAGE

דו is no coincidence that the end of the יום טוב season is marked by the end of the תורה as well. Starting from אלול, we have spent over 60 days engaged in self-growth and in a special relationship with הקב". This theme is ever more pertinent when looking at the day of ישמיני עצרת. We are famously told of the משל of the king inviting his sons to feast with him. As they are about to take leave, the king says: "Stay with me just a bit longer; it's hard to separate from you." After this week, we enter the period of מרחשון מ"ו בשבט, a bitter month replete with absolutely no holidays. If not for the פורים holidays of, מונה, and פורים, we'd be left with nothing until nop, which is 6 months away. As we transition from this awesome (in its literal sense) time to our regular, mundane lives, what are the messages we are supposed to take with us? What does the תורה want to leave us off with, that can get us through these next few weeks?

I think that we shouldn't just be looking at the end of the תורה, but at the end of the קריאת. After we finish וזאת הברכה, we go right back to בראשית, with as little delay as possible. This clearly shows that we're never finished. If we think we've reached a high, there is always more room to grow. We haven't finished the תורה, because there's still more to learn. We have to go all the way back and try to get whatever we can. רי"ב סאלאוייצ'יק was famous for preferring the חתן בראשית ס כיבוד חתן תורה. While חתן תורה is generally looked at as the biggest שמחת תורה, the חתן בראשית symbolizes the beginning of unlocked potential. While finishing is great, and we recognize the completion of a לימוד with a סיום, there is still the הדרן. We will return, and we will learn it better than we did last time. However, we don't end the day with בראשית. Something that often gets overlooked in the celebration is the מפטיר. On a day that was invented long after the חורבן בהמ"ק, we read about the שמיני עצרת f שמיני עצרת.3 The simple reason why is because we act as if it's a ספיקא דיומא, so it may be the יום טוב שמיני עצרת of שמיני עצרת. While that is true, let us look at the context of the מפטיר. The second half of פרשת פנחס is the פרשת המוספין, which is introduced by the קרבן תמיד. The תורה lists the קרבנות מוסף of every special day of the year, starting with אבת and באש חודש, and going through all of the ימים טובים in order of the year (starting with nos).

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Again, we see this concept of a large chunk of ימים טובים. At the very end of it all, we have the משמני עצרת of שמיני עצרת. We end פרשת המוספין, and the discussion of the פרשת משה אל בני ישראל ככל אשר צוה ה' את משה". What is the significance of this פסוק, specifically in this context? The מדרש stresses that the משה speaking directly to בנ"י בנ"י Since the בנ"י of שה speaking to משה speaking to משה didn't relay this משה בנ"י of פרשה בנ"י of משה stresses that בנ"י בנ"י of פרשת המוספין בעמר משה בנ"י exactly as מקב"ה commanded him.

The תורה, in recounting עבד, משה רבינו, a servant, is obedience to the orders of the master. An עבד ה doesn't even have control of who he gets to marry, and more importantly, he doesn't even have control over his own time. Whenever the master needs, the עבד is there, doing exactly what he was commanded to do in the way he was commanded to do it, no questions asked. After שה is gone, it is now יהושע בן נון who steps in as the leader. Immediately when we are introduced to יהושע as the leader, this message of wear being the ultimate עבד ה vereberates. Even הקב"ה Himself refers to עבד ה Being a leader yields great power, and with great power comes great responsibility. Don't let your power get in the way of your responsibilities. You are not the highest authority; that is Me. You are still subservient to Me and you have to carry out My commandments just as 'user' is departed by the way of your responsibilities. We find ourselves now in a situation similar to that of יהושע. We have been in our own since אלול. We got to witness our own version of the מדבר and the ענני הכבוד. We had a מני הכבוד. However, as we enter מרחשון, all of that is gone. It is now upon us to take from that קדושה into the mundane world. Just as יהושע accomplished this task with the message of משה עבדי on his mind, we have to take this message to heart as well. We are עבדי ה, and we have to be מקדש שם שמים in a world that needs it now more than ever. We are מקדש שם שמים by doing the מקדש שם שמים. The שמחת תורה our Master. Perhaps that is the מתורה of שמחת תורה. The משנה tells us<sup>9</sup>

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that a עוסק בתורה is עוסק בתורה. The גמרא tells us that we don't say עבדי on עבדי because even though we were freed from pan's decree, we were still עבדי אחשורוש. However, by noe, we were completely freed from the subjugation of פרעה. Yet, on שבועות, we became עבדי and we say הלל. The biggest freedom and is living a life for a higher purpose, and being guided by a moral code. These next few months will be relatively weak in terms of inspiration. We have to be able to inspire ourselves, and not only be the הקב"ה but the בנים as well.
